The YWCA Greater Harrisburg is seeking either <u>one 30-hr/week intern</u>, OR <u>two 15-hr/week interns</u> to assist with our Racial Justice Programs designed to further our mission of "eliminating racism".

This is an <u>unpaid</u> internship, but the YWCA will complete paperwork and supervision requirements needed by the academic institution to award academic credit.

Qualifications:

- 1. Passion for the YWCA's mission of "eliminating racism, empowering women and promoting peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all."
- 2. Interest in and basic understanding of racial justice work. Ideally, some coursework, training or other experience related to race/racism/racial justice.
- 3. Area of study in an applicable field (sociology, criminal justice, social work, etc.).
- 4. Good standing as a college sophomore, junior, senior or master's student.
- 5. Ability to work at least 15 hours per week on a consistent schedule.
- 6. Ease utilizing Microsoft Office and Adobe products.
- 7. Detail-oriented, efficient, hard-working and dependable.
- 8. Ability to take direction, work independently and multi-task.

Not required but a plus: Expertise in shooting and editing video footage; access to own video equipment and video editing software.

Duties:

- 1. Assist with #ShatteringStereotypes Project, including helping to develop content for social media, bulletin boards, etc. focused on breaking down a broad range of stereotypes related to our mission.
- 2. Assist with monthly Diversity Forum events, including advertising, preparing materials, setting up/tearing down and summarizing survey feedback.
- 3. Provide administrative support to the "Let's Talk: A Conversation about Race" program, including sending invitations, preparing packets, printing name tags and setting up/tearing down.
- 4. Assist with the work of the Criminal Justice & Community Relations Taskforce, including dissemination of "What To Do When Stopped by the Police" education materials, and administrative tasks related to the "Building Bridges with Diverse Communities" law enforcement training.
